## SCHOOL FINANCES AND FURTHER STRIKE ACTION

You may already know that the NEU has called for 2 further days of strike action, on 5<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> July. I want to explain to you why I am once again joining this industrial action, despite the inconvenience & disruption this causes children and families.

Our school budget setting meeting in April was the most challenging meeting I have ever experienced in my 12 years as head teacher. The simple truth is that school funding seems to be broken. Every part of our spending at Westgate has been cut to the bone but it is still not enough. We have some challenging times ahead as a school. The funding we have received in recent years has not kept pace in real terms with inflation/increased costs, and it comes on top of years of underfunding which we have previously been able to absorb through careful spending, an historic budget surplus, successful external funding bids and of course, the amazing financial support from Friends of Westgate and Westgate Windfall. As you may imagine, as head teacher, I feel extremely angry, frustrated and upset. Nobody in education wants to withdraw their labour, but I'm afraid it feels like there is no other choice right now, if we want to stand up for children and schools, and what they need and deserve. I will therefore be writing to you later this week with details of how the action will affect Westgate. Thank you for your patience and understanding in this difficult matter.

## FRIENDS OF WESTGATE




It's been a busy an successful year for FOW, and we're not finished yet! Obviously our proudest moment so far is the weekend's carnival entry, but

### **ANTI-IDLING BANNER COMPETITION**

Last Thursday was National Clean Air Day, and Eco Team used this day to launch a competition to design a banner to encourage motorists to stop idling their engine while stationary. Here are some facts about idling your engine that you may not know:

- It wastes petrol/ diesel and therefore money
- It adds more exhaust fumes to the atmosphere which increases air pollution
- Air pollution can cause asthma, allergies, heart & lung disease and even cancer
- Children are more at risk because their lungs are still developing.
- Idling your engine for more than 10 seconds uses more fuel and costs more than turning it off and restarting it.
- Air pollution is often higher inside a car than outside it.
- Stopping idling will help to improve the air quality around us.
