As a rule of thumb, you should always report concerning activity to CEOP:

<u>https://www.ceop.police.uk/safety-centre/</u> and in cases where you think criminal activity may have occurred, ring the police on **101** to report this. Finally, the biggest- and simplest- things you can do are: monitor the apps that your child uses on smartphones and tablets and take age restrictions (usually you have to be at least 13 for many social media apps) seriously; talk to your child regularly about what they are doing online; ensure that they know they can and should tell you immediately if anything happens that makes them

worried, scared or uncomfortable online, whether it is a friend's or a stranger's behaviour that is making them feel this way. Thank you again for your support with this ongoing challenge of modern life.

Yesterday I was extremely proud to share our school with 7 visitors: Anne Fell, senior school improvement adviser for Leeds, and 6 delegates from Latvia, Lithuania, Estonia and Poland, who were visiting Leeds as part of an Erasmus project called LELETO (Leading to Learn Together). I was able to share with them the way we have developed a collaborative approach to teachers' continuing professional development at Westgate, and in particular in the way we have developed our mathematics teaching. Anne



said, "Our 6 visitors were blown away by everything- and full of joy and excitement when they re-joined the full group in the afternoon. They couldn't stop talking about the children- who were found to be very motivated and co-operative, with 'super concentration', about the classrooms where there was plenty of talk, images and opportunities to share learning, and about the teachers and support staff who were so friendly and warm." Y1, Y3 and Y5 all welcomed visitors in to see one of their lessons and we spent some time talking about our school system, the children's learning and our approach to teacher development. We are very proud to have been chosen by the local authority to be one of only a small number of schools to host a group of delegates this week to share what we do.
