Where our pupils travel from	Westgate was built in 1871 and is surrounded by high-density Victorian terraced housing with no off-street parking. It is part of the conservation area and the KS1 building is Grade 2 listed. Westgate is located on a narrow one-way street, just off a busy main road which leads to the town centre. There is a pelican crossing on this road, near to school, which many children use. All of the residential streets near school have a significant volume of on-street parking.

Rail*	The nearest train station is Menston Station, which runs services which connect to Ilkley, Leeds and Bradford on the Wharfedale Line. There is a bus service (33, 34) from the station which stops near to Westgate on its way into Otley.
Roads*	Westgate can easily be reached by A roads from the three main town/ city centres of Leeds, Bradford and Harrogate, each of which are within 30 minutes driving time from school.
Walking Routes*	A safe walking route is marked along the pavement of the A659, taking you to cross the road at the pelican crossing, where there is also a school crossing patrol. This is suitable for families travelling from the east of school (towards Otley town centre). There is a a pedestrian underpass which traverses the A660, suitable for families travelling from the west, particularly along Bradford Road (towards Menston).
