Last Monday, we held our very first 'Anyone Can Day' and it was a huge success. Anyone Can Day was a fun, exciting, hands on and informative day which raised children's aspirations, challenged gender stereotypes and made links between the subjects they are studying, to possible future careers. There were 19 volunteers in total which helped to make this day an incredible experience for the children.



The day was an exciting, interactive experience for the children, allowing them to find out more about the world of opportunities that awaits them and tackle gender stereotypes.
