### Key Learning:

- Investigate the position of different leaders and the qualities a leader may possess.
- Compare their own experiences of role models and influences, with others and with other religions. Understand why Jesus is a role model and an inspiration for Christians and why they consider him their leader. Investigate stories about Jesus and Christian beliefs.
- Understand that Muslims consider the Prophet Muhammad to be their leader. Investigate stories about the Prophet Muhammad and explore Muslim beliefs about him. Understand why the Prophet Muhammad is a role model and an inspiration for Muslims.
- Understand why Moses is a role model and an inspiration for Jews and why they consider him to be their leader. Investigate stories about Moses and Jewish beliefs
- Find out about some modern-day leaders. Compare their own experiences of role models and influences, with those of others.
- Understand why some modern-day leaders are seen as role models and an inspiration for different groups of people.

### Key Vocabulary/ Concepts:

Leaders	A person who organises and directs a group
Qualities	Attributes or qualities a person possesses
Characteristics	Features or qualities belonging to a person
Inspiration / inspirational	A sudden brilliant idea
Prophet	Messenger of God

### Links with other religions/world beliefs:

**Humanist:** Have no spiritual leader but base their moral and ethical decision-making on reason, empathy and compassion for others.

**Sikhism:** Founder of Sikh faith was Guru Nanak

**Hinduism:** Hinduism is the oldest religion. It has no founder-it developed out of Brahminism

**Buddhist:** The Buddhist tradition is founded on and inspired by the teachings of Siddhartha Gautama. He was called the Buddha and lived in the 4th or 5th century B.C. in India.
