The Neighbourhood Plan steering group, of which I am a part, has recently established focus



groups to explore in more detail some of the issues raised in the initial consultation which was undertaken last year. One of the issues was, unsurprisingly, the need for an increased number of primary school places over the next ten years or so. We do want to ensure that parents




