This therefore means that they will be visiting us again before the end of the summer term! I wanted to let you know this in order to reassure parents so that you aren't alarmed when the inspectors return next term. A two day inspection will allow us to share all the fantastic things we do as a school in more detail with the inspectors, as well as the progress we are making with our target area of writing.

To mark this event, Mrs Cable, our Science Leader, has organised for each class from Y1 to Y6 to take part in a forensic science workshop on 12/03/18. Here is some information about the workshop, which sounds very exciting!

"A crime has been committed and it is the responsibility of each class to work together to piece together the evidence. Once inside our crime scene our young investigators must tape off the area in order to protect any evidence that may be found. Clues and evidence must be identified, collected, interpreted and analysed.

This includes finding, developing and characterising fingerprints, investigating tool marks and other impressions, identifying hairs and fibres and investigating blood, bones and DNA."

The workshops are suitable for all primary school children; however, younger investigators are always reassured that the story is make believe.



### ROMAN DAY



On Monday last week, Y3 & Y4 had a Roman Day led by 'Roman Tours'. This was a fun and interactive day which involved being taught by a Roman soldier and a Roman civilian. ### RUBBISH!
