







PARENT INFORMATION MEETING ABOUT SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS and DISABILITY (SEND)

A new SEND Code of Practice has come into force this term, following the Children and Families Act being passed by parliament. It means some changes to what parents can expect from schools if their child has a special education need or disability. While parents at Westgate should not notice wholesale changes for their child, as the way we work already is very much in keeping with the new Code of Practice, we would like to invite parents to attend an information meeting, led by our SENCo, Mrs Mitchell, who will run through key changes and what you can expect from us and other

professionals. The meeting is open to anybody but will be particularly useful to those parents whose children receive additional support in school. The meeting will be on **Wednesday 15/10/14 at 18:00 in the Mezzanine**. Refreshments will be available and parents and carers will have the opportunity to ask questions as well as hear about the new legislation and what it means for them. Please let the School Office know if you intend to come along so that we can plan seating etc. Thank you!
