which case they will receive the meat-free option. Allergies will also be catered for in line with normal procedure.

The day has been organised by Mrs Senior as part of her work leading Investors in Pupils. If you have logged on to the school website this term you will have noticed a new look, as we have changed our provider and created a Learning Platform. Many of our classes have now got their logons and have begun

to use the Learning Platform and we have more next steps planned for this half term. Firstly, we will begin to use the Learning Platform to send parents texts and emails, in the same way as we currently use Teachers2Parents. Secondly, we will be rolling out parent logons, on a gradual basis. It is really important when you receive your logon details that you logon and let us know if you have any difficulties with this.

Future developments for families will include: online parents evening booking (hopefully next term!) and at a later date, electronic payments.

Your parent logon will enable you to look at everything your child can see/ does. You can appreciate that these new developments take time to do properly and, like any IT development, may have the occasional teething problem. Please bear with us as we are confident that the new Learning Platform will bring huge benefits in terms of learning and communication.
