### **ONLINE COMMUNICATION**

Before half term, the children had a special assembly connected to Safer Internet Day. We try to teach children how to behave responsibly online through the e-Safety curriculum across school. This includes thinking carefully about what they say online, as it is so easy to be unkind and for that unkindness to reach a large number of people quickly and to escalate or become amplified. It is therefore upsetting to hear that a number of our parents have expressed concern about negative comments passed by other parents about members of Westgate staff online, for example in WhatsApp and other social media groups.



Please remember that all of our staff work very hard indeed and that all of their efforts are focused on trying to give all of the children the best education possible. Of course there will occasionally be times when as parents you feel frustrated or do not share staff's point of view. However, I would ask everyone to consider what they post online, and ask yourself whether what you post, in closed groups and elsewhere, is something you would like to read about someone you care for, or something you would like the subject to read about themselves. All of our staff are approachable and are happy to listen and respond to concerns which are raised respectfully. Raising issues on social media, however, will rarely if ever lead to a solution. Above all else, I would urge everyone to model the behaviour we ask of children online and #BeKind.

We hope that part of the work will involve some workshops for children later this year, to help them think about how we can all look after local wildlife.

# **RECYCLING AT WESTGATE**

Just a reminder from Eco-Team that we offer some recycling facilities for families and that these raise money for school at the same time! You can recycle:

- used batteries (all year round)
- printer cartridges (all year round)
- clothes, shoes and home linens (termly Ragbag collection)

We have also teamed up with Leeds City Council to offer a recycling facility for unwanted electrical goods later this year- look out for more details in due course!
