Y6 pupils have now had their places for high school confirmed, and Reception places for Nursery pupils will follow in about 6 weeks' time. Last week we welcomed most of our governing body in to school for the first face to face Governor Day since February 2020. SUSTAINABLE TRAVEL

Yesterday we had a visit from Strider, the mascot for Living Streets' Travel Tracker scheme which we participate in! The children were very excited to hear that we have been top of the leaderboard for all of Leeds recently! We aim for 90% of our journeys to be active, which includes park & stride (park at Waitrose and walk), walking, cycling and scooting.
