# LOCAL DEMOCRACY



A week ago today, Andrew Ross (a parent governor) and I met with Cllr Sandy Lay and Cllr Colin Campbell, to discuss further our ongoing concern and dissatisfaction at school's status as a polling station. During the visit, we were able to do a walk round of our site and talk in detail about the implications of polling days for our school-families, children and staff. We appreciated the

opportunity to speak with our elected members, and to be listened to. The Councillors appreciated and understood our concerns. In addition, Cllr Campbell sits on the working group within Leeds City Council that oversees and reviews matters relating to polling in Leeds-including the designation of polling places. I will of course share with you any updates that I receive on the matter in the coming months, via this newsletter. In the meantime, if you have not yet voiced your concerns with elected members but would like to do so, please refer back to my earlier letter, which gives our ward's city councillors contact details.

She works alongside children who may need emotional or academic support. From September, Zoey will be working with us one day a week! This will be fully risk assessed and she will be based

with Mrs Eley and myself. We are very much looking forward to her joining our team and I think she will be very supportive to all of our children. (Safe) Contact with animals is proven to help us to alleviate stress and anxiety, and help with emotional regulation. No child (or adult!) will be made to spend time with Zoey however. # SCHOOL EQUIPMENT NEXT YEAR \*PLEASE READ\*

As we approach the end of the school year, you will inevitably start to look ahead to school supplies for September. We'd like to draw your attention to the following:

- a) Children should not bring pencil cases to school next year. School supplies pens, pencils, crayons etc. and pencil cases take up unnecessary space and provide distractions in the classroomso please ensure your child leaves these at home.
- b) We have ongoing issues in KS2 cloakrooms with overloaded peas. When choosing bags for your child for September, please ensure that PE kit is in a traditional, drawstring-style bag. Any other style – e.g. rucksacks, shoppers, oversized handbags - simply do not fit onto the pegs. Unsuitable bags will be sent home and replaced with a carrier bag in school until replaced. Similarly, when choosing a school bag, please ensure that this is not oversized and will fit comfortably on your child's peg. Typically, pegs are spaced 20cm apart, so anything much wider than this will not fit! Finally, please make sure that everything-

PE kit, bags, uniform - is clearly labelled with your child's name! We have a real issue with unnamed, unclaimed lost property at the moment.


