Key Learning

- Understand the importance of the Bible to Christians.
- Jesus' importance to Christians and how he spread Gods word through stories.
- Develop an awareness of Christian rules, 'right' and 'wrong', values and commitment.
- How Jesus taught his message by using parables, what we can learn from parables exploring Jesus' teachings.
- Jesus taught to love God and love your neighbour.
- Jesus taught an obligation to care for and help others. People will be judged according to how they care for others.
- Consider the meaning of friendship and of being a true friend.
- Think about situations when we have to change or do something really difficult to be a better person
- Appreciate that Jesus demonstrated love to, and sympathy with, the sick.
- Understand the Christians believe that Jesus cared for and healed people.
- Consider the qualities of kindness and caring.
- Learn that elements from within religion could be applied to situations they experience in their own lives.
