UPDATED BEHAVIOUR POLICY This year we have updated our Behaviour Policy, in light of an evaluation carried out by staff last term.

The Behaviour Ladder starts on **Green** as before, and now goes upwards through **Bronze** and **Silver** to **Gold**, which children can achieve by doing the right thing in lessons and around school. Going down from **Green**, children may move onto **Yellow**, which is the equivalent of a reminder and reflection. If poor behaviour persists children may move down through Amber and **Red**. It is expected that very few children will reach **Red**, and children can always move up and down from any point during the day. If a child is violent towards another pupil or adult they move down to **Red** automatically.

From this term, there are further sanctions for moving to Amber or Red. Each class will have Golden Time on Friday at 14:30, and reaching Amber or Red will result in missed Golden Time (5 and 10 minutes respectively). Reaching Red twice in a week will result in missing all of Golden Time, and the following week the child will have to earn back their Golden Time with consistently good behaviour through the week, in 5 minute increments.

■ We hope that this structure is clear for children and helps them all to make good choices and understand the consequences of their actions.

HOLIDAYS IN TERM TIME AND ATTENDANCE

A reminder for parents and carers thinking ahead already to family holidays in the coming year, that holidays taken in term time are not



usually authorised and parents taking children on holiday in school time risk a fine, in line with government and local policy. In addition, where a child has been reported as absent due to illness and we have good reason to suspect that in fact, he/she was on holiday, parents will be asked to provide proof that he/ she was in fact poorly. Fines are issued on a 'per parent, per child' basis.

When requesting time off from school for any reason, parents must fill in an absence request form (available from the school office) and this should be done as far in advance as possible. It must be done via the school office rather than the class teacher, even if it is 'just' a request to leave before the end of the school day. Please also note children's that calculated attendance is bv information management system on their presence at registration. Absences for any reason other than an approved school activity that mean a child misses registration (morning or afternoon) will affect their overall attendance record. This is standard procedure for schools. Thank you for your understanding in this

matter.

We continue to use electronic means as our main method of communication. This means that the default position is that newsletters and letters are

sent via email to people with parental responsibility and *not* as a hard copy. This is to counteract the ongoing problem that no matter how it is managed, many children lose letters between being given them by their class teacher and getting home. It is therefore essential that parents check emails regularly: we can ensure that letters are emailed to you but we can't make you read them! If you have the eSchools app on your smartphone, all letters home will be kept in there and you will never lose one again. Letters with a

slip to be returned will always also come home as a hard copy (unless, of course, they are mislaid).

Texts are sent to the first named contact only, except in the case of separated parents. Again, if you have the eSchools app on your smartphone, instead of receiving texts as SMS messages, you will receive them as a push notification in the app.

Finally, I will endeavour to include all the information you need in newsletters, rather than in lots of separate letters. Please read them and make note of information/ dates relevant to you.

Just a reminder that Westgate Out of School Hours (WOOSH) provision is available to

children in Nursery to Y6, from 07:45 to 08:50 in the morning and from 15:15 to 18:00 in the afternoon. Charges are £3.00 for a morning session, and £8.50 after school, or £6.50 for further siblings. It may also be counted as part of a child's free 30 hour Nursery entitlement, if you wish. Both must be booked beforehand. Following Mrs Chilton's appointment as our HLTA, Mrs Kerry is now the WOOSH leader in the morning and Mrs Divers in the afternoon. WOOSH staff continue to be almost exclusively teaching assistants at Westgate who know all of our children well.

From this term, billing will be managed by the school office. Families will shortly be receiving confirmation of any current outstanding balances and going forward you will receive regular summaries of credits and outstanding fees.
