It was introduced in 2017 as part of school's move to offer fully flexible nursery provision. Because of this, leaders of WOOSH have to have the relevant full qualification. Staffing ratio requirement is always met because of this. Q does it run during the holidays? No provision for this. Not looked into as not sure how we'd staff it. Art camp for students using the school as a letting during the next holiday with 7 free places for PP children Agreed with small changes about removal of references to appendices; to be reviewed April 2023.
