As a Music Champion School, we are trying hard to give children more opportunities to see and hear live musicians from all sorts of backgrounds and traditions.



Of course, as well as enjoying watching live music, this half term will also see the whole school have opportunities to be part of a musical performance. Every class will be part of a Christmas Production: Foundation Stage children are already busy practising 'Mary's Knitting', while KS1 are working on 'Prickly Hay' and KS2 the puntastic 'Stable Manners'. That's not to mention Choir's Christmas performances - at the Victorian Fayre, at the Christmas Tree Festival, at the Rotary Club, at Gordon Larking Court... and 8 children will also be singing in the LSMA Christmas Concert at Leeds Town Hall. 
