#### SCHOOL COMMUNICATIONS




We continue to use electronic means as our main method of communication. It is therefore essential that parents check emails regularly: we can ensure

that letters are emailed to you but we can't make you read them! The SIMS Parent app is essential to ensure you can easily update contact and medical details. Letters which require a response will include a hyperlink to complete an online form, rather than requiring a return slip.

Please note that parents should not email teachers unless it is absolutely essential. Any messages during the school day should come via the school office as teachers will not ordinarily pick up emails while teaching. School policy is that emails are only sent, read or responded to between 08:00 and 18:00, weekdays only during term time. Teachers are usually available at the beginning and end of the school day and are often able to return telephone calls during breaks.

#### LEARNING MENTOR



For those who do not know me I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself and tell you a little about my role in school. My name is Caroline Eley and I am the Learning Mentor at Westgate Primary. Hopefully you will have seen me in the playground as you drop your children off. My job is to work alongside the other adults in

school and parents to identify anything that may be stopping children from having the very best school experience. These things may include friendship issues, changes in family circumstances, family bereavement, self-confidence and self-esteem issues and difficulties with emotional regulation. I work with children 1-1 or in a small group in our Nurture Room and support children in the playground. I also teach PSHE (Personal, Social, Health & Economic education) & Mindmate (lessons supporting children's emotional and mental well-being) lessons to whole classes across the school. At Westgate we pride ourselves on really getting to know each individual child and their family. When we work together your children have the best school experience. In previous years I have offered a drop in sessions for parents who had concerns or just needed to chat. This could be a great way to start getting to know other parents, especially if you are new to the school or would just like some company. Parenting is the most difficult job we do and sharing and supporting one another through our worries and triumphs with people going through the same thing is so important. # **HOLIDAYS IN TERM TIME AND ATTENDANCE**

A reminder for parents thinking ahead already to family holidays in the coming year, that holidays taken in term time are not usually authorised and parents taking children on holiday in school time risk a fine, in line with government and local policy. In addition, where a child

In addition, where a child has been reported as absent due to illness and we have good reason to suspect that in fact, he/she was on holiday, parents will be asked to provide proof that he/she was in fact poorly. Fines are issued on a 'per parent, per child' basis.

When requesting time off from school for any reason, parents must fill in an absence request form (available from the school office) and this should be done as far in advance as possible. It must be done via the school office rather than the class teacher, even if it is 'just' a request to leave before the end of the school day.

Please also note that children's attendance is calculated by our information management system on their presence at registration. Absences for any reason other than an approved school activity that mean a child misses registration (morning or afternoon) will affect their overall attendance record. This is standard procedure for schools.

# DOMESTIC VIOLENCE NOTIFICATION PROJECT

A joint initiative between Leeds Children's Services and West Yorkshire Police is in place to support children who are resident in households where there are incidents of domestic violence and abuse. It is designed to provide confidential notification to schools on any incidents of domestic violence and abuse which occur within a child's household that might have an impact on a child whilst they are in school. The project will ensure that a member of the school staff is trained to allow them to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, and ensure that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in or witnessed a domestic violence or abuse incident. We are keen to offer the best support possible to our pupils and we believe this is extremely beneficial for all

# ONLINE SUBSCRIPTIONS AND HOMEWORK

This week you will receive a letter about homework in Reception upwards, which will outline our expectations.



Two of the best ways you can help your child to succeed and feel confident at school, now and in the future, are to establish regular daily homework routines from the outset, and to ensure you read with your child every day. Homework is best done little and often and does not need to be one long marathon slog of

misery. If you are struggling to find a routine that works, do ask your child's teacher for suggestions to make things work for your child and your family. Homework tasks are set via Microsoft Teams from Y1 upwards.

Your child has access to a number of online learning resources to support their home learning; you should already have received an email outlining these in more detail, and giving you a reminder of their login details for each resource.

# WOOSH




Just a reminder that Westgate Out of School Hours (WOOSH) provision is available to children in

Nursery to Y6, from 07:45 to 08:50 in the morning and from 15:15 to 18:00 in the afternoon. Charges are £4.16 for a morning session, and £9.36 after school, or £7.28 for further siblings. It may also be counted as part of your child's funded 30 hour Nursery entitlement, if you wish. Both sessions must be booked online in advance, and bookings that are cancelled with less than 24 hours' notice will be chargeable. Please log on to

your School Gateway payment app to book and pay for WOOSH sessions.

NB: Pupils using WOOSH as part of their 30 hour Nursery entitlement do not need to book as this has already been taken into account.

Please ensure you take the time to read the weekly 'Next Week at Westgate' email which comes out on a Friday. This will keep you informed of any changes to music lessons or clubs and keep you up to date with any class / school events.

### **SCHOOL TRAVEL**

This week, we have restarted the Travel Tracker in Y1-6 (Reception & Nursery will start later this half term). Each morning, children complete a quick online survey in class to record their journey to school. They can earn a badge for every month where they walk, scooter, cycle or 'park & stride' at least once a week. The closure of Scarborough Road at the beginning and end of the school day, and Waitrose offering their car park for parents to use for 'Park & Stride' through the School Streets initiative has made it easier and safer than ever to choose a more sustainable school journey.
