### SUPPORT FOR LEARNING



First of all, a big thank you to everyone who is coming to consultation evening this week. The teachers spend a lot of time preparing for these evenings so that they are as useful as possible for you as parents. You will have noticed this term that we have talked about some basic skills that are the building blocks of children's progress. It's OK not to understand 'how school works these days'- things in education rarely stand still and sometimes it's hard even for teachers to keep up!

However, there are 3 very simple things all families can do to support their children. Reading: hear your child read and read to your child, and talk about the books you read together. This will help your child become a better reader and a better writer too. Mathematics: help your child to practise remembering number pairs that make every number between 2 and 20, and then their multiplication tables. It will have a huge impact on every other calculation they do. Writing: when your child writes, check it over with them and help them to add in any capital letters or punctuation they have missed out. This is a good habit for all children to get into. We appreciate that some families already do these things, and the benefit to their children is very obvious in the classroom. I hope that these simple messages will take some of the worry out of how to help your child and help you to incorporate these activities into your daily routine. By working together like this we can ensure all children make the best possible progress.



### TRAINING DAY



Last week, our first day back at school was a training day for all staff. We had training from the Leeds Restorative Practice Team. Restorative Practice is an approach to conflict

resolution and behaviour management, which puts the emphasis on children (and adults) understanding what they have done, the consequences of their actions and how they affect others, and having an active part in deciding to make amends. It is based on strong community relationships, and a sense of responsibility and belonging. This is the first part of a piece of work we are doing, the next part of which is to establish peer mediation in school. Our overall aim is to give children resilience and skills to enable them to sort out small disagreements themselves and to manage friendships well. Our intention is for peer mediation to begin next term.
